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for anyone who has yet to discover mcewan s storytelling genius this is a dazzling introduction the time is 1955 in postwar berlin the combined forces of british and american technological intelligence is set to invade the soviet communications system the story follows a young british post office technician beginning his dizzying descent into the ever deeper echelons of electronic surveillance beneath the surface of berlin at the same time he meets a young german woman maria as his two worlds private and political claim him leonard senses his life is to be remarkably altered but he cannot foresee the horror that is to come readers familiar with ian mcewan will know to brace themselves for the unexpected yet it is impossible to anticipate the impact of this novel an espionage

thriller with a subtle and haunting execution the innocent is a brilliant read and possesses perhaps one of the most powerful and satisfying conclusions capturing the spirit of the end of the cold war

a member of a british american surveillance team in cold war berlin finds himself in too deep in this wholly entertaining work the wall street journal from the booker prize winner and bestselling author of atonement twenty five year old leonard marnham s intelligence work tunneling under a russian communications center to tap the phone lines to moscow offers him a welcome opportunity to begin shedding his own unwanted innocence even if he is only a bit player in a grim international comedy of errors his relationship with maria eckdorf an enigmatic and beautiful west berliner likewise promises to loosen the bonds of his ordinary life but the promise turns to horror in the course of one terrible evening a night when marnham learns just how much of his innocence he s willing to shed don t miss ian mcewan s new novel lessons

into a berlin wrenched between east and west comes twenty five year old leonard marnham assigned to a british american surveillance team though only a pawn in an international plot leonard uses his secret work to escape the bonds of his ordinary life the promise of his new life begins to be fulfilled as leonard becomes a crucial part of the surveillance team while simultaneously being initiated into a new world of love and sex by maria a beautiful young german woman it is a promise that turns to horror in the course of one terrible evening a night when leonard marnham learns just how much of his innocence he s willing to shed the plot crackles like thin ice with dread and suspense sunday times

in imagining history one must inevitably rely on its textual representations whether fictitious or supposedly objective yet always subject to the constraints and conventions of textuality still it is precisely by exploiting and consciously relying on the textual in the presentation of the past that contemporary authors including politicians and makers of history strive to provide it with current significance emotional impact and universal meaning the study of such attempts benefits from a variety of perspectives encompassing not only classical but also popular texts and media an interdisciplinary collection of papers devoted to the issues of retelling rewriting and representation of the past in fiction and various text types this volume juxtaposes modern and post modern understanding of collective versus personal history the contributors are scholars specializing in literary studies e g postcolonialism

and popular fiction linguistics e g critical discourse analysis and cultural studies e g media studies bringing a wide spectrum of theoretical insights into the field the collection opens with papers on the general changes in viewing history that have occurred since the 19th century further papers discuss postcolonial feminist and gender related perspectives on history reflected in postmodern fiction revealing the power struggle around the depiction of the past the next part of the volume is devoted to the presentation of historical breakthroughs in political and media discourse finally the collection draws attention to some unorthodox visions of history involving alternative worlds and fantastic elements encountered in the genre of speculative fiction

his review has got to be in by mid day tomorrow at about 9 pm his mind will grow relatively clear and until the small hours he will sit skipping expertly through one book after another and laying each one down with the comment god what tripe then suddenly he will snap into it all the stale old phrases a book that no one should miss something memorable on every page jump into their places like iron filings obeying the magnet thus did george orwell writing forty years ago in confessions of a book reviewer describe the labours of a typical literary hack precious little has changed over the intervening decades the servility of the satirical magazine private eye lord gnome s literary companion assembles in thematic order the best of these columns to present an astringent rude and funny survey of publishers and the published

stephen lewis a successful author of children s books takes his three year old daughter on a routine saturday morning trip to the supermarket while waiting in line his attention is distracted and his daughter is kidnapped from there lewis spirals into bereavement that has effects on his relationship with his wife his psyche and time itself

now a major bbc drama starring benedict cumberbatch only ian mcewan could write about loss with such telling honesty benedict cumberbatch on a routine trip to the supermarket with his daughter one saturday morning stephen lewis a well known writer of children s books turns his back momentarily when he looks around again his child is gone in a single moment everything is changed the kidnapping has a devastating effect on stephen s life and marriage memories and the present become inseparable as stephen gets lost in daydreams of the past and time bends back on itself dragging stephen s own childhood back into the present

this book offers a discussion of seven canonical novels by ian mcewan the cement garden the comfort of strangers the child in time the innocent black dogs atonement on chesil beach introducing radical new readings which are offered not as ultimate and conclusive solutions of the textual puzzles but as possibilities to engage with the text creatively to enrich the critical consensus and restore interpretative freedom to the readers this project formulates a strategy of inclusive reading an approach to the text that does not seek to reduce it to a single interpretation and yet is comprehensively informed through the analysis of the primary text critical discussion authorial comments and the context of the composition each reading demonstrates the metafictional structure of the texts indicating that mcewan s works may be treated as invitations to roam within their worlds examining the multiple frames of their structure and the meanings generated thereby all the chapters attend to submerged repressed or deliberately masked voices the cement garden is seen as a multi layered dream with a shifting hierarchy of dreamers the comfort of strangers is viewed as an inverted metafiction with insubstantial characters corrupting more complex heroes the child in time is read as stephen s book written for his dead daughter the innocent as a memory narrative of leonard who refuses to notice maria s role as a spy in black dogs the over exposure of unreliability is studied as a screen for personal trauma in the analysis of atonement briony s claim to authorship is questioned and cecilia is suggested as an alternative narrative agent finally examining on chesil beach both characters voices are reconstructed in search of the superior narrative power which in the end is seen to be elusive as the text seeks to undermine the hierarchy of voices

fledgling writer briony tallis as a 13 year old irrevocably changes the course of several lives when she accuses her older sister's lover of a crime he did not commit

the author of *mercy* and *a cold mind* returns with a tale of suspense set in the world of international smuggling an investigator in the houston police department's intelligence division is found shot marcus graver's task force finds evidence of a conspiracy linking the government to one of the world's most ruthless criminals

begins on a windy summer's day in the chilterns when the calm organised life of joe rose is shattered by a ballooning accident what happens is shocking and tragic but strangely inco sequential the consequences come after for that fatal accident brings joe together briefly with jed parry unknown to rose something passes between them

ian mcewan is one of the most significant and controversial british novelists working today his books are both critically and academically acclaimed and embraced by readers across the world although primarily a novelist he has also written short stories television plays a libretto a children's book and a film adaptation across these many forms his work retains a distinctive character that explores questions of morality place and history nationhood sexuality and gender now fully updated for its second edition this guide brings together a collection of new critical perspectives on mcewan's oeuvre not only covering the early works and his writing for the screen but also incorporating detailed and original analyses of the later work including new readings of his latest books *solar* and *sweet tooth* with an updated and extended guide to further critical reading on mcewan the book also includes an interview with

the author himself a chronology of his life work and times and the full text of a lost early mcewan short story

the titles are primarily from fiction including along with novels particularly important poetry plays and short stories though a few are from literary works of nonfiction each entry gives title author year of publication and a detailed explanation of the story behind the title

high doses of wisdom low doses of advice calls attention to the practical skills that can sharpen our ability to make better decisions embedded in these chapters is a sincere concern about salvaging relationships with others and with oneself in a writing style that is warm and infused with humor dr chiesa gently but firmly suggests ways to deal with the difficulties of life head on this is a wise book regarding the importance of solitude friendship marriage generosity and restorative action in these complex times it is a must for anyone who is longing for change in many aspects of their lives

as their holiday unfolds colin and maria are locked into their own intimacy they groom themselves meticulously as though someone is waiting for them who cares deeply about how they appear when they meet a man with a disturbing story to tell they become drawn into a fantasy of violence and obsession

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
